From the Pastor's Desk

Did you ever take a science class where you got to do experiments? I took chemistry classes in high school and college; and I loved lab days. These were the class session where you didn't have lecture or homework – instead you had EXPERIMENTS to do. We would use test tubes, beakers, Bunsen burners and all kinds of chemicals and tools; and we would discover what would happen when we combined all those things in different ways. It was fun and it was exciting and sometimes you really didn't know what to expect as you did your work.

In the same way many of us did experiments in chemistry or physics classes, we can do experiments in our walk of faith as well. We can try things out, test our feelings and abilities, see what happens when we live our lives just a tiny bit differently for a change.

This spring we are going to be looking at how to have spiritual conversations with other people. Using examples from the ministry of Jesus and from the rest of Scripture we are going to investigate different tools that might help us connect with other people in new and meaningful ways.

Along with learning from scripture during worship, we are also going to be challenged with some experiments each week. These will be a handful of simple tasks we can undertake that could help us grow in connection with other people about the good news of Jesus.

This past week we talked about hospitality; we learned how interpersonal relationships are the primary venue for living out God's mission to tell the world about Jesus. Hospitality is the tool that lets us create space in our lives and our hearts to connect with others! An attitude of hospitality is the first step we can take to telling other people about King Jesus and His love for us.

I want to reiterate my encouragement to all of us to undertake AT LEAST ONE experiment in hospitality. The experiments you could choose from this week were:

1. Make a list every night for a week – who are the people you spoke to today in real life? (Phones and electronic communications don't count for this experiment) How many of those people are you already in a meaningful relationship with? Are you happy with those numbers? Think through your answers!
2. Go out of your way to greet someone you normally wouldn't talk to – embrace the awkward! – Jesus walked up to two strangers on the road and said "WHAT ARE YOU TALKING ABOUT?" Can you follow Jesus' example and start a conversation with others in a similar way?
3. Talk to a close friend and family member – ask them to help you think about the level of hospitality you have in your life. Be open to honest feedback! Ask them about your strengths and weaknesses and see if the two of you can think of ways to challenge yourself to grow.

I want to encourage all of us – do an experiment! We don't have to have it all figured out, but we can learn a lot from making an effort to try something new and see what happens!

April 30 - Jude 1:24-25

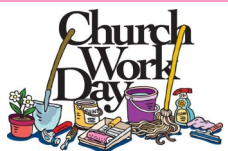


You are invited to the graduation party of Nick & Tessa St. John on May 18 at the church from 4-7 p.m.
