

The Weekly Update Fredericksburg Presbyterian Church February 5, 2025

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

When I worked as a print news reporter we would have a critical meeting every morning. It was the same in each newsroom: we'd gather at a conference table, with our coffee and our notebooks, ready listen to others and to share what stories we were developing. Each morning, the team worked together – reporters, editors, publishers, all of us - to set a vision for what the paper was going to look like when it went to the press that night. We discussed what was most important, what needed more attention and what we knew that could help others before we started that day's work.

Often, things changed. New stories would break, events would surprise us, additional information would be discovered, and we would adjust. But still these meetings (in old school print journalism-speak they are called "budget meetings" because you have a limited amount of space to "budget" to stories in a newspaper) were essential for outlining the work of the day and for shaping the intention of the whole group.

I think the same kind of thing is helpful for a church! This Sunday we are going to have a meeting following the worship service where we will spend a bit of time talking about what's happening at FPC.

First, we'll talk about events to celebrate from 2024. (spoiler alert – it was a great year!) We'll receive our annual report with information from different ministry areas and an overview of how God has blessed us in the year that has passed.

But most of our time we'll spend looking forward! We'll discuss what's most important, we'll see what our leadership is sensing and discerning for the next season of church life and we'll catch a vision for how we can ALL contribute to the work of being God's disciples here in Fredericksburg!

Just like at a newspaper, we don't know how the day may turn out; we may have new opportunities and new challenges to face in 2025. But it is still incredibly beneficial to look forward with enthusiasm to how we see God moving among us and what we hope to reach for in the coming year.

I want to encourage you to attend this meeting and to share in the vision and excitement for FPC in 2025. Let's outline the work of the day – what is God calling us to be and to do in the coming year. I believe that God has some amazing things in store for us as we look forward to His leading and His guiding.

My confidence doesn't just come from how awesome I know this church is (I know this church is great!) but my confidence comes from God – who calls us to go and make disciples, to be His ambassadors in the world – and has promised to equip and meet us as we seek to live faithfully as a church pursuing faith in Him!

February 5 - Ephesians 1:22-23
