Dear Beloved,

Do you remember that one Sunday, last July, when we fried fish for supper and then worshiped at night?

I love that memory. It demonstrated so many beautiful aspects of the family of God. It broke our routine, brought a group of men together for a purpose (frying fish and potatoes), and showed generosity in the donation of 80 lbs of fish by Paul and his brother. It was a moment of celebration, fellowship, and meaningful worship.

I still remember the songs (from my childhood) that Earl played around the campfire and the liturgy that Beth led called "A liturgy for the enjoyment of bonfires in the night." It is a good memory and good memories increase our joy when we remember them!

That night I shared with you an ancient prayer for Compline (night) that still hits me in the feels. See if you remember it:

Keep watch, dear Lord, with those who work, or watch, or weep this night, and give your angels charge over those who sleep. Tend the sick, Lord Christ; give rest to the weary, bless the dying, soothe the suffering, pity the afflicted, shield the joyous; and all for your love's sake. **Amen.**

The thing about that prayer (and many good prayers) is that it rings differently at different times. When we ask the Lord to keep watch over those who **work**, or **watch**, or **weep** - there are many different settings and emotions attached to each of these three conditions. Workers who love or hate the night shift. Keeping watch at airports, state parks or parking lots. Weeping in sadness or pain; loneliness or loss; worry or wondering.

What I could not articulate that day, but can see in looking back, is the mixture of joy and sorrow. The Lord dwells with us in our full range of experiences good and bad, even the peculiar way that things unexpectedly works out, clearly showing God's hand.

That July morning, when we did not have church, I was with Fonda Schlegel and the Nelson family in her final moments. She went home to Jesus, on Sunday morning, in her home overlooking their farm. That night we gathered and celebrated as a family of faith. God is in the highs and lows. God dwells among his people.

These are some of the memories that I cherish as I prepare to complete my time with you. Even this morning, I felt tenderness and tears with the women who attended GLOW. We have joy because we spent this time together, and sorrow that what has been will come to a close. God meets us in both.

Keep watch, dear Lord, with those who work, or watch, or weep this night, and give your angels charge over those who sleep. Tend the sick, Lord Christ; give rest to the weary, bless the dying, soothe the suffering, pity the afflicted, shield the joyous; and all for your love's sake. **Amen.**

May you know this reality - God keeps watch. He tends and blesses and soothes and shields us. AND the family of God is a blessed place to be.
