#### Hard jobs are better with a friend!

When I worked as the leader of a school, we used to store lots of wonderful classroom materials in a garage-type building just a few steps outside the back door. The garage was not heated, and some of the items were stored in the garage loft, which was accessed by a ladder. This arrangement was necessary, but the teachers didn't like it. Sometimes they gave up using really good stuff in order to avoid going into the cold and hauling tubs into their classroom. So we invented a motto: *Hard jobs are better with a friend.* It grew to be the common practice to go out to the "shed" in pairs to get what





you need. This good solution led to an increase in community and relationship.

The same is true here at FPC. Our ministry strategy is to complete the work of the church in Ministry Teams. Here is how our FPC Ministry Team handbook explains it:

Our strategy is to work in teams to engage the church in ministry. Each ministry team plans and leads ministry in a particular area of church life, always striving to involve as many people from the church as possible, in carrying out the work of ministry. Ministry teams implement the vision of the church and live it out.

This matches Paul's vision and understanding of life in the body of Christ.

There are different kinds of spiritual gifts, but the same Spirit is the source of them all. There are different kinds of ministry, but we serve the same Lord. God works in different ways, but it is the same God who does the work in all of us. A spiritual gift is given to each of us so we can help each other. (1 Corinthians 12:4-7)

This week your Session met for their first meeting of 2023. In planning for the upcoming year, they looked over the names of seventeen people leading ministry teams at this moment. What a wonderful, cooperative structure to share responsibility among a wide variety of people, all working together for a common purpose. I give thanks for each of you that has said "yes" to leading! And there is always room for more people to participate. If you are available to serve in a new way at church, in this season, reach out to me, I'd love to place you with a team.


