

### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This summer has been a warm one. More than 160 million people in the US were under heat alerts on Tuesday and dozens of all-time heat records have been broken over the past weekend. We've had plenty of hot days here in Fredericksburg, too.

I don't know about you, but I'm not a big fan of the really warm weather; it can be miserable to be outside for any amount of time. And when it's hot AND dry, the grass turns brown, the ground gets hard and it can be very unpleasant to be outdoors.

The book of Jeremiah contains a short poem that I think of when the temperatures rise and it's hot and uncomfortable outside. The Bible records the poem, and puts its words in the mouth of God; in Jeremiah 17:5-8 we read:

### This is what the Lord says:

"Cursed is the one who trusts in man, who draws strength from mere flesh and whose heart turns away from the Lord. That person will be like a bush in the wastelands; they will not see prosperity when it comes. They will dwell in the parched places of the desert, in a salt land where no one lives.

"But blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose confidence is in him. They will be like a tree planted by the water that sends out its roots by the stream. It does not fear when heat comes; its leaves are always green. It has no worries in a year of drought and never fails to bear fruit."

God compares two different types of people: those who trust in human strength, wisdom and understanding and those who trust in the LORD. He says that every person is like a bush or tree planted in the ground. Those who trust in mere human ways can't survive since they have no source outside of themselves to sustain them. But those whose confidence is in God prosper, even in the heat and drought because their source of life and hope is in God. This is the definition of true wisdom: trusting in God and not in ourselves. And it is this trust that ensures that we can weather the hottest, hardest, emptiest days.

I want to encourage you to spend some time with this little poem in Jeremiah. Read it over many times, think about how the heat affects things in our lives and think about the comparison God is making between the circumstances of life and the heat of the desert. How has trust in God sustained you in hard times? How can you continue to put your confidence in Him? Where is God asking you to trust Him more?
