#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This past weekend we concluded our Sunday morning series called "Greater Things". We spent seven weeks looking at the way the first followers of the risen Jesus fulfilled the promise He made in John 14:12. Jesus had told His disciples: "Very truly I tell you, whoever believes in me will do the works I have been doing, and they will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father." The true stories of the early church demonstrate how they began preaching, teaching and healing, just as Jesus had.

But Jesus' promise of "greater things" wasn't just for that first generation of followers. That promise is for US, too! Jesus has promised that WHOEVER believes in Him will do the works He had been doing. So, we have to ask ourselves a question as we arrive at the end of this series: What are the "greater things" we at FPC are doing?

I am led to think of three primary areas where we can be living out the promise of Jesus to do the work that He did:

- 1. We do the kind of work that Jesus did when we live out our allegiance to the Kingdom of God. Jesus said He only did as His father instructed Him; He was committed to showing His faithfulness to God in His words and actions. We can demonstrate our allegiance to Christ's kingdom as we prioritize knowing, worshiping and serving Him. Jesus is our King and we are people who follow where He leads. Is there something you could do this week to offer your worship and service to God in a new way?
- 2. We do the kind of work that Jesus did when we meet the world's needs in His name. Jesus came to announce the Kingdom of God, and He displayed to all the VALUES of that Kingdom. As He healed the sick, cared for the needy and demonstrated God's power, He was illustrating God's presence in the world. We can participate in this work as we care for others around us, sharing our resources and time to serve those in need and testifying to the power of Jesus in our own lives. Is there an act of kindness or generosity that you could do this week to represent the kingdom of God in our community?
- 3. We do the work that Jesus did when we proclaim salvation in Christ to the world around us. A key way we can do the work Jesus did is to share the message that Jesus came to share: that the grace and mercy of God was being poured out into the world through His death and resurrection. Jesus came to give His life for those who believe, and now we get to proclaim the forgiveness of Jesus to others wherever we go. Is there a person in your life whom you can tell about the love of Jesus this week?

It is my prayer that we will be a people whose deep desire is to follow Jesus in the work proclaiming the Kingdom of God; and that as we do that work, we will grow in faith and faithfulness to Him. Let's do "greater things"!
