A number of years ago, I was friends with an amazing older woman named Ruth. Ruth was lovely; and Ruth was intense. Regularly, when I would see her, she would give me a hug, and then grab me by the elbows, look me straight in the eyes, and earnestly ask: "Why did you get out of bed this morning?"

This question was Ruth's way of asking what I really cared about; and she asked this question of many people. Her intent was cut to the quick of why we do what we do and to remind us how important the "why" really is. Ruth tended to want to skip the small talk and get right down to the deep conversations of life. She wanted to know what motivates people, what excites people, what makes them want to go about their day and accomplish things in the world.

Some people would answer Ruth's question by talking about caring for their families or advancing in their jobs. Some people would answer Ruth's question by sharing about a hobby they loved or an upcoming trip they were looking forward to. Those are good reasons to get out of bed in the morning.

And there were also some people, who from time to time like me, had difficulty answering. We've all had seasons of life we don't always feel like we have some grand motivation for getting up and doing life each day. Sometimes the best answer people could muster for Ruth was something along the lines of: "I don't really have any idea right now." That's an okay answer to the question, too.

It was Ruth's great concern that we be purposeful about life – and she believed that purpose was best centered on Jesus and His call on our lives. Ruth challenged us to get out of bed every morning because of the desire to know Jesus and to represent His Kingdom in the world around us. I think it was always her hope that people would answer the question: "Why did you get out of bed this morning?" with a response like: "I got out of bed because I want to love and serve Jesus with this day He's given me."

Sometimes it hard to live into this purpose, but it's always worth reminding ourselves that God's best for us is to live with our hearts and minds fixed on Him. As Scripture says in Colossians 3:1-3: "Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things. For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God."

How would you answer Ruth's question? What is your "why" for your life? Might this be a week, or today be a day, when we say: I got out of bed this morning to know and serve Jesus?
