From the Pastor's Desk

Is it ever okay to be disappointed in God? Is it ever right to be angry with God? There are plenty of stories in the Bible of people who wrestling through their frustration with the Lord. Sometimes they are mad for what God has done, and sometimes they are mad that God seems absent; but many times in Scripture God's people don't understand why God allows the difficult things to come.

When Job looks on the loss and suffering of his life, he can't understand why God would let all that hardship happen to him, and he says to God: "I cry out to you, God, but you do not answer; I stand up, but you merely look at me." (Job 30:20). **Job feels abandoned by God.**

In the book of named after him, Jonah is so angry he wishes he were dead. He unrighteously accuses God of wrongdoing in the case of Nineveh and tells God all about His anger. **Jonah feels that God is acting unjustly.**

King David also challenges God, asking why He won't help him in His time of struggle. In Psalm 13:1-2 he says: "How long, Lord? Will you forget me forever? How long will you hide your face from me? How long must I wrestle with my thoughts and day after day have sorrow in my heart? How long will my enemy triumph over me?" **David feels that God is uncaring.**

This Sunday we started our study of the book of Ruth, and noticed that one of it's main characters, Naomi, believes that God has afflicted her. She accuses God of making her life bitter and bringing her misfortune. *Naomi feels that God has hurt her.*

In all of these stories (and others throughout Scripture) we encounter individuals who are suffering. There have been hard things in their lives, and they are struggling to reconcile their belief in a GOOD God with the reality of BAD circumstances.

This is something we all often feel. It is normal to question what God is doing when He feels distant, unfair, silent or hurtful.

But it's important to note, that even though we FEEL these things about God, that doesn't mean that God is actually the way we perceive Him to be. Job will come to see that God has been faithfully overseeing all things in his life. Jonah will understand God's compassion. David will recognize how much God cares for Him. And Naomi will experience the goodness of God again.

The key thing to learn from these stories is that God doesn't shy away from our frustrations, but instead He loves us through them. In all these stories, those who were suffering brought their pain and confusion to God himself; they turned to the Lord in the midst of their struggle, and He heard them. This can be an encouragement to us when we feel the same way. We, too, can bring our heartache to God and trust that He is good, even when we don't experience it in the here and now.
