Peter gave us some advice in 1 Peter 3:15-16. Andy Stanley concluded his book IRRESISTIBLE with this verse as our marching orders for New Covenant living. Here's what Peter said, "And if someone asks about your hope as a believer, always be ready to explain it. But do this in a gentle and respectful way."

Learning to tell others what we believe and backing it with the reasons for our hope can seem like a daunting task. This world desperately needs us to speak truth with love. The problem is most of us just avoid these conversations. We label them too tough, not necessary, awkward, (enter your favorite excuse). You can do what Peter is asking and you can do it well. I know this of you because you have a relationship with Jesus. The world needs people that have a relationship with Jesus to talk about it. It is not a secret. It isn't meant to be kept private.

You are to be a light on the hill. Jesus will take care of all the hard stuff, but we need to tell folks why we love Him. I have never struggled telling others about my awesome kids.
