Dear Friends,

In 1986, I went on a summer mission trip with [Teen Missions International](#) to the village of JuanJui, Peru in South America. We prepared for two weeks in Merritt Island, FL, at something called "bootcamp." Then my 17 teammates, 4 leaders, and I took off in a plane, wearing work boots, to go "get dirty for God" (a Teen Missions motto).

It was a formative summer, living primitively in tents in the pastor's back yard, being awakened by loud roosters every morning, and constructing a building. One of my favorite parts was the memory verse competition. 50 verses, in the old-school KJV in a speed-type competition. I still remember those verses. This one applies to our latest adventure in Marion:

**So built we the wall; and all the wall was joined together
unto the half thereof: for the people had a mind to work.
Nehemiah 4:6, KJV**

I'm so glad that God has given us a literal "wall" to build and a "mind to work." When I first arrived at FPC and was getting the lay of the land, I heard from multiple people that this community was at their best when there was a mission or cause to tackle together. Our Lord saw that willingness and group identity and He directed our path to a potential partner, on in need of our hard-work and know-how. And we will be the ones that are blessed. Don't miss this. MONEY COUNTING PROCEDURES

The ECO Denomination and Presbytery sent out a "best practices money handling checklist" for all churches. Fredericksburg Presbyterian Church had one security item that is not currently one of our procedures: having two people count the offering and verify the deposit. Historically, we have had one individual handle the offering for privacy reasons. While we all agree that Angie is totally trustworthy, the finance team and Session believes that for the church's security and for Angie's protection, the two-person policy is a good one. Therefore, to comply with the ECO best finance practices, beginning October 1, 2023 the offering will be counted and signed for by two individuals, approved by the Session.

ASSISTANT BOOKKEEPING POSITION OPENING

Renee Schaaf has notified Session of her desire to step away from the position of Assistant Bookkeeping Secretary by the end of the year. Session is looking for someone with some bookkeeping experience, who is willing to act as the Assistant Bookkeeping Treasurer. The duties include but are not limited to:

- Pay all church bills
- Prepare information for payroll
- Transfer funds between accounts as necessary
- Track special donations
- Maintain financial records
- Prepare monthly bank reconciliations of all financial accounts
- Tax filing
- Monthly Financial Reports to Session.
