

### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This past Sunday we talked about God's invitation for us to care for one another. It's an invitation not just to care ABOUT one another, but an invitation to care FOR one another. Care – having concern for and regard for the needs of another – is expressed as we become aware of the needs around us, and then seek to help meet those needs in Jesus' name.

For thousands of years, Christians have organized themselves in order to meet one another's needs through the ministry of deacons. The position of deacon is described throughout the New Testament; and there are even specific deacons mentioned in scripture, like Stephen (Acts 7) Philip (Acts 8) and Phoebe (Romans 16). From the very beginning, Deacons had the ministry of care.

Deacons are even well attested to outside of Scripture, with one of the earliest references coming in a letter written around 110 A.D. to the Roman emperor Trajan from Pliny the Younger. The letter mentions two women who were slaves and also deacons; in it, Pliny describes his desire to torture these deacons (this was a time of persecution for Christians) in order discover more about their religion. I find it fascinating and also beautiful that the deacons who serve today are a direct reflection of Christian practice from thousands of years ago! Our deacons have the same job as the first deacons did: to care for the people of the church.

Here at FPC we have a group of nine deacons who minister to the congregation through acts of care and service. This fall we're making a concerted effort to make sure we all know our deacons and that we are connected to the care we all need. We have begun a new organizing structure called our "care net". This means that every meaningfully connected FPCer will be assigned a deacon who will pray for them and be the contact person for anything that person needs. Over the coming 3-4 weeks, your deacon will do his/her best to reach out to you and make sure you know who they are. They'll be sharing information about themselves and asking how they can pray for you. Your deacon is ready and willing to be there for you and your family if you ever have a need.

We'll also be recognizing our deacons in the weekly update. Every week or so we'll feature a different deacon so you can get to know them better. There are ways you can support the work they do: first, pray for them, too! Ask God to give them strength and wisdom to minster when they have the opportunity. Also, get to know your deacon! Share your prayer concerns with them and let them know how they can support you and minister to you.

And remember: as we care for one another, we're living out of the tradition that was set for us centuries ago – let's keep going as we love and trust God by responding to the invitation to care!
