# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

About 1,970 years ago there was a church in Greece that was having some issues. There were arguments, divisions and struggles. Some of those divisions revolved around who was the true authority in the church and should therefore be followed and deferred to. Some trusted Paul, the missionary who established that church; and some wanted to follow a man named Apollos, who had done fruitful ministry there. These two factions were stirring up trouble for the body of believers.

Paul received word about the conflict there and sat down to write a letter of encouragement and challenge. He wanted to remind them that the work that needed to be done was God's work alone. He reminded them that there was no competition between Apollos and him; and, as a matter of fact, the two of them were partners in God's work. The letter he wrote has come down to us as 1 Corinthians, and in it Paul says this:

What, after all, is Apollos? And what is Paul? Only servants, through whom you came to believe—as the Lord has assigned to each his task. I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God has been making it grow. So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow. The one who plants and the one who waters have one purpose, and they will each be rewarded according to their own labor. For we are co-workers in God's service; you are God's field, God's building. (1 Cor. 3:5-9)

Scripture makes it clear that growing the faith of God's people is *His* work! God makes things grow! We can do things like plant seeds of truth found in God's word. We can water those seeds with faithful living and nurture that growth in community; but only God makes things grow.

This is something I learned this summer with my first garden. I did work in the garden and with a lot of help and some good advice I learned how to prepare the ground, make sure it had water and was cared for. But God made it grow!

I spent many afternoons in my garden, pulling weeds, watering in dry spells, and spraying to get rid of potato bugs (gross!). And most frequently, as I worked, I found myself praying for our church. I prayed that God would give us spiritual growth. That our faith would deepen, like the roots of a plant, that we would grow firm in our trust in Jesus, like a thriving garden, and that we would bear fruit, as we share the good news of Jesus with others and serve the world in His name. As I pulled weeds, I prayed that God would take away from us any hindrance or barrier to experiencing Him; and as I watered, I asked God to pour out His presence and comfort into our lives.

It is my sincere hope that God will help our church flourish. We are going to work to help nurture and care for our spiritual development; but most importantly, we can pray and ask God to bring us the spiritual nourishment and growth that only He can give!

 Identify what regular Sunday morning worship looks like (eg: every Sunday, three times a month, etc.)




 Learn and Grow in Community - God invites us to KNOW Him
