

# Weekly Update

Fredericksburg Presbyterian Church September 20, 2023

Hello FPC Family,

Last Sunday, we launched a new series on the life and writings of Peter. When I think of Peter's "call story" it feels a bit wooden. Peter and Andrew are fishing, Jesus walks up (like a robot) and says "Follow me" and the guys leave their nets to become "fishers of men" (See the basic story in [Matthew 4:18-20](#) and [Mark 1:16-18](#)).

Now Luke gives us the "good" story ([Luke 5:1-11](#)). Here Jesus is teaching to a crowd on the shore, sees the guys, and asks them to row him out a bit. There is a back and forth about lowering the nets. They say, "we fished all night and caught nothing." Peter does it anyway and they catch so many fish that the nets start to break, the boat begins to sink. James and John row over to help. By the time it is all over, two sets of brothers stop fishing the sea to fish for people. It's a good story because it gives us more reason to understand how they dropped everything at the invitation of Jesus.

And still, there is this fourth account of how this all occurred. Leave it to John to give a completely different account ([John 1:35-42](#))! While the details vary, the central theme is consistent. Andrew, who was initially a disciple of John the Baptist, hears John's testimony about Jesus and accepts Jesus' invitation to "come and see." They hang out for a day. The first thing Andrew does is to go tell his brother Peter that he has found the Messiah. Together they return to Jesus. Jesus just looks at him and says, "You are Simon the son of Jonah; you shall be called Cephas (which means Peter)."

What a powerful illustration of how we can experience Jesus and immediately bring our sibling to Jesus. This is one-to-one transfer of the good news. From such a seemingly simple meeting of Jesus, Peter's life will never be the same. He will be called to lead the church, something he had no idea about at the beginning! May we never forget to bring our friends to Jesus!

**MISSION MARION:** On Sunday, Missy Lemon announced that our Outreach Team designated funding for the Hands of Hope building project in Marion. We are thrilled to announce that we now have the funds and we now have a date - October 14. Next we need to order lumber and get to Marion for a Saturday work day together!

The way this project came to us gives hints that God is in it! Our youth mission trip changed at the last moment, Pastor Rob Howard made a quick decision to host us, he introduced us to Pastor Cory, and it seemed like a possible fruitful partnership connecting our gifts to this kingdom opportunity.

We are hopeful that arrangements can be made to go to Marion on either October 7 or 14. We are collecting a "special offering" to fund our completing more work (drywall, lumber).

Together, let's consider how we can support this - through work, prayer, or finances.

## Seeking Patterns: Rethinking the Flood

Over the next few weeks, I'm going to be writing about how we can read one Bible story in light of other Bible stories. What better way to do this than start with a story we're all familiar with - Noah's Ark.

Before making connections though, we need to read the story! This week we are going to leave our preconceived notions behind, and look at what the Bible says, instead of what we think it says.

### SECOND HOUR RETURNS

It is time to re-imagine and re-establish good second hour community and discipleship. Here are our plans for fall:

**Children** - will meet weekly in Children's Room 2 .

**Youth** - will meet weekly in Salt Shakers rooms under the direction of Michelle Wood.

**Adults** - will meet weekly in smaller groups, three of which will stay together for 7 weeks, and one that is drop-in ready for whoever would care to stay. Here are the choices:

**Sermon Fellowship** (cafe) with Brian Parrott. Find a seat in the cafe for a time of fellowship and discussion questions pertaining to the weekly sermon. This group is intentionally open to whoever desires to stay each week.

**Faith Essentials** (classroom 1) with Nancy Dumford This class will begin with Covenant Class content and then extend into interactive activities to gain a deeper understanding of ECO's Essential Tenets of Reformed Faith.

**Living a Rich Life** (classroom 2) with Barry Henderson and Nick Miller This is a practical class that will discuss some of the financial challenges that face most families, using illustrative stories. A "rich life" has more to do with relationships, purpose, and satisfaction; putting money in its proper place. Based on a book by author James Lenhoff.

**Servant Leadership** (classroom 3) with Paul Miller. We will dive into the truth that whoever wants to be great must be the servant of all. This is a practical class that can be applied to work, family, and church life.


