

# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This past Sunday we gathered with fellow brothers and sisters in our community at the ballfield to join in worship together. It was a beautiful Sunday morning, and we participated together in praise, prayer, God's Word and the Lord's Supper.

The Bible text shaping the message offered that morning from Pastor John Risner at MCA, was a set of parables from the book of Matthew. They are short but packed full of significance. Here is the text form Sunday morning:

### Matthew 13:44-46

"The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field. When a man found it, he hid it again, and then in his joy20 went and sold all he had and bought that field.

"Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant looking for fine pearls. When he found one of great value, he went away and sold everything he had and bought it."

These twin parables teach us something important that Pastor Risner pointed out; its something important that we can reflect on. The kingdom of God – the setting right of all things through the sacrificial death and resurrection of Jesus – is something we take possession of. We surrender our lives to God and chose to follow Jesus as Lord and Savior of our lives.

But the kingdom of God is ALSO something that takes possession of US! It is a merchant that finds a beautiful pearl and sells everything to have it! Jesus comes to choose, rescue and adopt us! He gave His life for us so that we could be with Him forever.

The Kingdom of God, and the message of the Gospel, is **both of these things** at the same time. It is both God's pursuing love, coming to rescue and redeem His beloved AND it is our response, to say yes in trusting faith and to give Him our very lives in return!

There is a children's song written by Andrew Peterson that I used to sing to my nephews when they were very little. This song captures well the beauty of the truth of God's grace that chases after us to make us His own. The first verse of this song says:

"There once was a man Who found him a treasure Buried out under a tree. He sold all he had Just to own it forever That treasure is you, you see."<sup>1</sup>

Friends – you were the treasure that God gave everything to have! His very Son, His very life, all that He had, He gave, so that He might have us with Him.

What a beautiful truth to celebrate together


